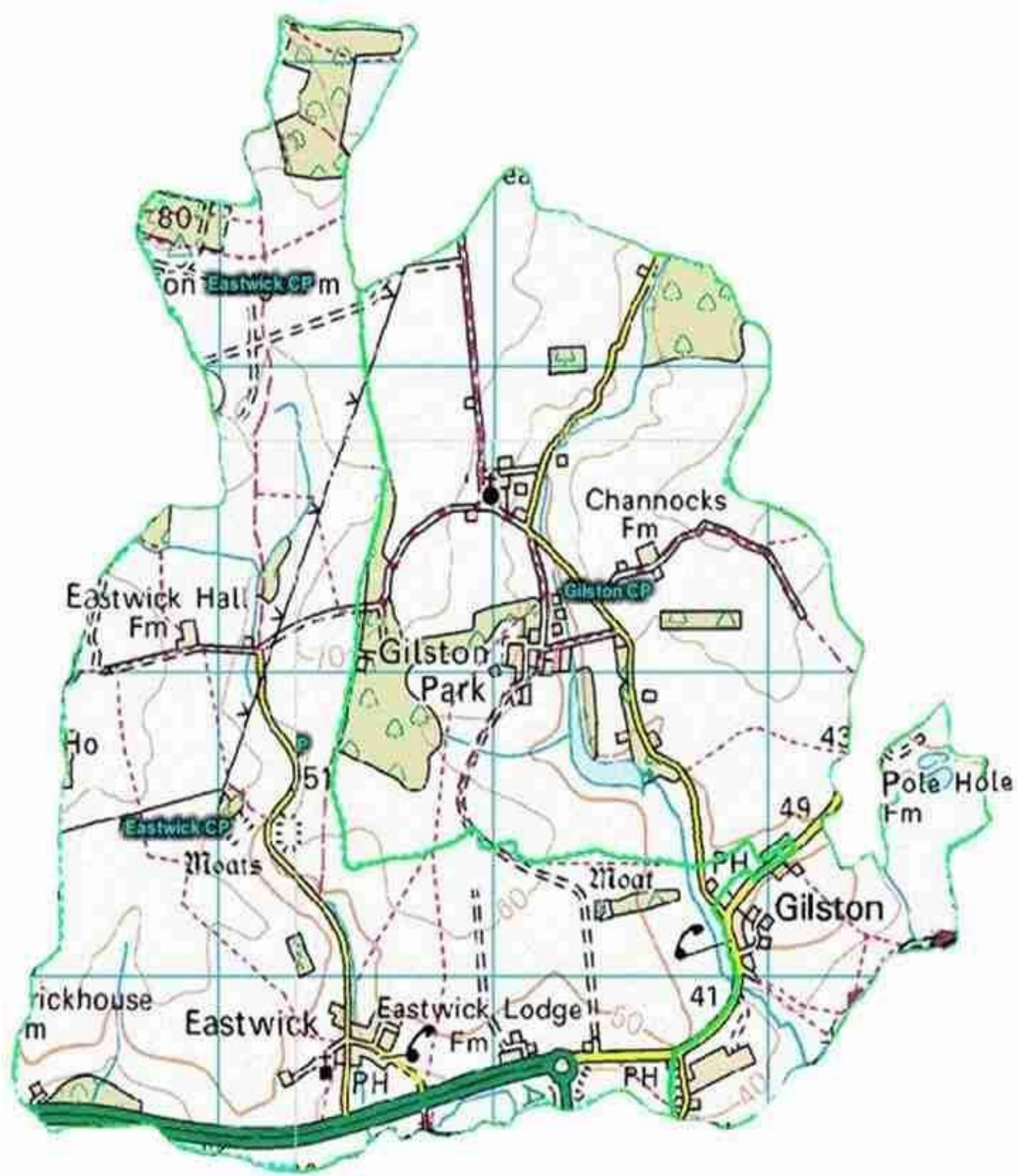

- 2. TO RECEIVE OUTGOING CHAIRMAN'S ANNUAL REPORT FOR 2014-2015**  
Cllr Orson gave is annual report. The full report is attached to these minutes and can also be found on the parish web site.
- 3. ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN**  
Nominations were received for Cllr Mark Orson to be Chairman. Cllr Mark Orson nominations was proposed by Cllr Hughes and seconded by Cllr Geddes and Cllr Orson accepted the position of Chairman.
- 4. TO RECEIVE THE DECLARATION OF ACCEPTANCE OF OFFICE FROM THE CHAIRMAN (CODE OF CONDUCT)**  
The new chairman Cllr Orson signed the declaration of acceptance and was witnessed by the Parish Clerk.
- 5. ELECTION OF VICE CHAIRMAN**  
Nominations were received for vice chairman were Cllr Spike Hughes. A unanimous vote was given and was proposed by Cllr Geddes and seconded by Cllr Orson and Cllr Hughes accepted the position.
- 6. 2014-2015 ACCOUNTS TO BE PRESENTED TO COUNCIL AND TO BE APPROVED**  
Cllr Orson reviewed the Parish Council summary of receipt and payments accounts for year ending 31<sup>st</sup> March 2015. These had been previously been circulated to the council members with no problems. These were proposed by Cllr Geddes and seconded by Cllr Hughes. The accounts were then signed by the chairman Cllr Orson and Christine Law – Responsible Officer.

**2. TO RECEIVE COUNCILLOR'S DECLARATION OF INTERESTS**

- a. None given

**3. MINUTES FOR APPROVAL**

- a. Minutes of the business meeting of the 12th January 2015 were proposed by Cllr Hughes and seconded by Cllr Geddes
- b. The business meeting of 9th March 2015 was not held as the meeting was not quorate.
- c. Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting of 9th March 2015 were proposed by Cllr Geddes and seconded by Cllr Orson. Items a and c were then signed as a true record by Chairman Cllr Orson.

**4. CO-OPTION OF PARISH COUNCILLORS**

- a. Following the recent election of parish councillors three parish council seats remained vacant. Amanda Olsen and Xavier Litvinov were co-opted to become parish councillors and to fill two of the vacant seats

**5. ACCOUNTS**

- a. The Clerks written accounts summary had been distributed before the meeting and were accepted by full council.
- b. To agree and approve the Annual Return for the year ended 31st March 2015 – copies had been distributed before the meeting and these were signed by the Chairman and the Parish Clerk.
- c. To agree and approve the Annual Governance Statement 2014/2015 – copies had been distributed before the meeting and these were signed by the Chairman and the Parish Clerk.
- d. Village Hall hire for the period April 2014 to March 2015. Cheque for £210.00 was raised.
- e. HAPTC annual membership for £227.25. Cheque was raised.
- f. CDA Herts membership for £30.00 Cheque was raised.
- g. Parishcouncil. Net - support package for web site of £300.00 – cheque was raised.
- h. Amberol Ltd – village planters for £1,221.60 – cheque was raised.
- i. Zurich Insurance – a cheque for £243.80 was raised.
- j. Eastwick and Gilston PCC - churchyard maintenance. This was discussed and a cheque was raised for £800.00, to cover the current and previous financial year when the grant was not paid.
- k. Consolidate Stock – this is for information only. HM Treasury announced that 2 ½% Consolidated Stock will be redeemed in its entirety, at par, on 5 July 2015. 'Post meeting note – the redemption has been received of £333.23'.
- l. War Memorials maintenance – It was agreed to top up the pea shingle at Gilston Memorial at a cost of £78.00 and that hard landscaping around both Eastwick and Gilston War Memorials should be sprayed with weed killer when the grass areas are cut at an additional cost of £5.00.
- m. Plants for village planters – plants and compost from Oakridge Nurseries at a cost of £188.88.
- n. Clerk's salary – to meet NALC guidelines the clerk's salary was increased and the increase back dated to 1st January 2015.
- o. Council computer – Cllr Orson informed the meeting that the computer used by the clerk was over 10 years old and running outdated versions of software. Replacement options will be researched for review at the next meeting.

Items a-o were proposed by Cllr Olsen and seconded by Cllr Hughes.

## **6. PLANNING AND ASSOCIATED APPLICATIONS**

- a. Terlings Park – building work is progressing and there are no major issues to report.
- b. Two-storey side extension, single storey rear extension and front port – 1 Park Cottages, Eastwick. Development Control has refused this.
- c. Eastwick Hall Farm, Eastwick – Appeal has been refused.
- d. Insertion of dormer window to rear and change of garage to habitable room. Internal alterations to include removal and insertion of walls and the creation of new bathrooms to ground and first floor levels. Brickwork to be cleaned and re-pointed – Homewood, Gilston. Development Control has granted this application.
- e. Single storey rear extension – Edwardian conservatory. 2 Gilston Mews, Gilston. This application has been withdrawn.
- f. Single storey rear extension: depth 4.0metres; Height 4.0metres: Eaves height 2.65 metres. 2 Gilston Mews, Gilston. This is for information only.
- g. Two storey side and rear extension. 15 Channoeks Lane, Gilston. Development Control has granted this.
- h. Single storey rear extension. 6 The Stables, Gilston. This application has been withdrawn.
- i. To replace existing wooden casement windows and french doors with 12mm slime line unites. Homewood, Gilston. This application has been refused by Development control.
- j. Two-storey side extension. Single storey rear extension, front porch (roof) – amended application. 1 Park Cottages, Eastwick. ‘Post meeting note this has been granted by Development Control’
- k. Pole Hole restoration. Herts County Council has reported that as at 25 June, the operator was hopeful of completing all works to the west of the footpath within two weeks. The works will then progress onto restoring the haul road across Pole Hole landfill and it is anticipated that this could be achieved in a period of approximately two to three weeks, weather depending. This leaves the former stocking area that has been shaped to the final profile but still requires some stone clearance and final topdressing with topsoil. The operator remains confident that all restoration and site clearance works including removal of remaining plant and offices will be completed before the end of the summer.

Prior to the final closure of the gates, the operator has agreed to undertake a clean-up of the highway, street furniture, gullies and pavements through Gilston.

A site visit for the parish council is to be scheduled during July.

## **7. STOP HARLOW NORTH CAMPAIGN**

- a. Cllr Hughes informed the meeting that the next SHN meeting will be held on 3 July. He was unable to attend and Cllr Orson will attend in his place.
- b. We are unlikely to have a final version of the District Plan until the middle of next year and the campaign will be ready to respond.
- c. Cllr Brunton was asked for his views on building north of Harlow in the Gilston area. His perception is that East Herts Council’s working assumption is for building in the Gilston Area to be part of the emerging District Plan. There are still technical studies to be completed and these could still impact this conclusion but otherwise it is difficult to see how East Herts is going to make up the required numbers without some building in Gilston. If the District Plan process were to fail this will allow developers to put in planning applications and push their proposals forward outside of a District Plan.
- d. We were informed that District Planning decision are made by the East Herts Executive and so it makes sense to lobby this group as part of our campaign and this is where we need Cllrs Brunton’s support.

## **8. PARISH PATHS**

- a. It was reported to the meeting that several paths have not been cut. Cllr Orson will contact Nicholas Maddex and request an update on the parish paths maintenance schedule.

## **9. NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN**

- a. Cllr Orson informed the meeting that an application for the Neighbourhood Plan designated area encompassing the parishes of Eastwick & Gilston and Hunsdon has been

made and is now going through consultation which will conclude on 23 July. Further meetings had been held with Hunsdon Parish Council and Anthony Bickmore has agreed to chair the joint Neighbourhood Plan Group.

**10. HIGHWAYS**

- a. Eastwick Hall Lane – Cllr Orson informed the meeting that patching works have been scheduled for the period 17-23 August and that Highways have cleared the overflow from the pond at the top of the lane and are assessing the ongoing water run off from the spring at the bottom of the lane. Eastwick Hall Lane is now on Highways major works programme for 2016/17 (subject to final confirmation nearer the time).
- b. Gilston Lane – Hertfordshire County Council have issued a ‘temporary closed and temporary waiting restrictions in Gilston Lane, Gilston/U172 unnamed road - this is from the junction with Pye Corner north westwards and north eastwards to its junction with Bakers Lane, a distance of approximately 2840 metres. Work will be carried out at some time during the period 3 July 2015 to 13 January 2016.

**11. VILLAGE HALL**

- a. The meeting was informed that now Keith Harvey is no longer a councillor a representative from the Parish Council is needed to stand on the Village Hall Management Committee. To be discussed at our next meeting.

# RECTOR'S AUGUST LETTER

## The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath.

This statement comes from the Gospel of Mark chapter 2 where Jesus was criticised for allowing his disciples to pluck heads of grain in a field, rub the husks off and eat the kernels on the Sabbath. As far as the religious authorities were concerned they reaping, threshing and winnowing on the Sabbath, the Jewish holy day which runs from sunset on Friday to sunset on Saturday when no work should be done.

The point Jesus was making was that the fourth commandment, "Remember the Sabbath, and keep it holy," was not given as a way of finding favour with God, but as a means of keeping our lives in a proper balance of work and rest. It was for our benefit, not God's. For centuries Christians were against any sort of work being done or shops being open on Sundays. It was an attempt to force people take one day's rest each week. The Church moved the Sabbath from Saturday to Sunday, the day of Christ's Resurrection.

These days life is too complicated for all work to stop for one day of the week. Emergency and health services have to function 24/7; but it is still vital for all of us to take proper periods of rest and relaxation on a regular basis. As a priest, I work every Sunday but I take one day off during the rest of the week when I am free to do what I like without worrying about my parishioners. The same idea applies to taking annual holidays. Many with school age children will be heading for the sun (or at least in hope of it) in August. These periods away from normal life with friends and family are essential to our survival for the rest of the year. Now my children have grown up I am free to holiday at other times. Parents, it a good thing to look forward to.

Two news items have focussed on these ideas recently. The government wants the NHS to function equally seven days a week and for shops to open for longer on Sundays. I see no basic objections to either of these proposals so long as the people delivering them are allowed proper time off elsewhere in the week. Also, those who, for religious reason wish to restrict the hours they work on Sunday's or other days that are sacred to their faith should be free to do so. Perhaps if you can shop for longer on Sundays you will also be able to find time to come to church.

So, remember the Sabbath and enjoy your holidays.

### THE HUNDRED PARISHES SOCIETY

The very last parish introduction to go onto our website happened to be for Barkway. This parish lies in the far northwest of the Hundred Parishes area, one of just three (with Barley and Nuthampstead) in the district of North Hertfordshire.

Our introductions always include a few photos, usually recent images, but Barkway's also has a copy of a wonderful photo that had been published as a postcard in 1904. I'm hoping your magazine editor will be able to print it with this article, but if it doesn't appear here please go to our website [www.hundredparishes.org.uk](http://www.hundredparishes.org.uk) Select the Parishes section from the menu and then, from the alphabetical listing, click on Barkway. When I first saw the picture, I knew I had to go and find where it was taken and perhaps take an equivalent photo of today's scene. I hope it may inspire you to do the same.

I was not disappointed. The view down the main street had hardly changed – except that there were now pavements and the once-empty main road now had parked cars – including mine. Nearly all buildings are still recognisable, although their uses may have changed. Today there is just one pub, where once there were many to service the horse-drawn coaches on this once-popular route between London and Cambridge.

The local lasses didn't all come out to marvel at my pocket camera, nor did they wear long posh frocks and bonnets. I also didn't see any lads in flat caps, but it wasn't difficult to find the spot where the photographer had stood. Besides, the stroll through the village was a most pleasant experience, with little passing traffic and lots of lovely old buildings. I hope this old photo may inspire you to explore Barkway.

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## Urgent phone scam warning

Dear Watch Member,

Hertfordshire Constabulary is reissuing advice to the public following a spike in the number of phone scams that have seen people lose thousands of pounds of their savings.

Yesterday (Wednesday, July 15), 11 people reported that they had been contacted by fraudsters. In three of these incidents money was stolen. A total of more than £50,000 was taken from the victims.

Whilst most people recognise the scams for what they are, they can have a devastating effect on people's lives as not only do they lose a large sum of money, their confidence and trust in people is shattered.

The police are asking the public to make contact with their relatives, friends and neighbours to ensure that as many people as possible know about the scams.

The police and banks would:

- **NEVER** ask for your bank account details or PIN number over the phone, so do not disclose these to anyone, no matter who they claim to be.
- **NEVER** ask you to withdraw money and send it to them via a courier, taxi or by any other means.
- **NEVER** ask you to send your bank cards, or any other personal property, to them via courier, taxi or by any other means.

If you are not happy with a phone call and are suspicious of the conversation you have with the caller then please end the call and contact police via the non-emergency number, **101**.

Remember, when reporting a suspicious phone call to police, wait at least five minutes before attempting to make the call or use a mobile or neighbour's phone to ensure you're not reconnected to the offender.
